Sample of Projects

- Four-year longitudinal study in Odisha to assess impact of mother tongue-based multilingual education (MLE) on tribal children funded by Bernard van Leer Foundation (BvLF). Almost 500 children were tracked from preschool to class 2.
- Evaluations of three projects implemented by Odisha-based NGO Committee for Legal Aid to Poor (CLAP) to analyse progress and constraints and present recommendations.
- Preschool content mapping study for Sesame Workshop to provide recommendations on material development based on best practices.
- Series of professional development workshops for Indraprastha college students on topics including developing curriculum for preschool children, multiple intelligences, and developmentally appropriate practices (DAP).
